Reflection for the Week

Sunday, June 2, 2024

The Gospel of this Sunday calls us to look at ourselves with our conscience. Do we really understand what God is calling us to do? And are we really able to grasp Jesus' teachings correctly? Today, Jesus wants to make us aware of the meaning of human freedom, which brings back growth in us at the Faith level. As Jesus walked with his disciples, he walks with us, to teach us how to nourish one another in our relationship with God.

How do we live our relationship with God or with others? Are we tempted to always be the judge of other people's behavior? Do we feel not invited by Jesus to let the Spirit of God renew in us his invitations to follow him and renew our faith every day? Like the disciples who walked with Jesus in the wheat field, we too are invited to follow him, and let ourselves be instructed by his Word.

Lord, let us look at you to learn how to act, to live according to your example. Send upon us, Lord, your Holy Spirit so that he may grant us the grace of discernment in the way we live our faith.
