Reflection of the Week

Sunday, June 30, 2024

In the Gospels, the word of God confronts us with the realities of our life such as suffering, death and above all, anguish. Don't we sometimes doubt the presence of God in certain situations in our lives? Today, we see the healing of the woman who had suffered for twelve years, and the resurrection of Jairus' daughter. These miracles show the goodness of God and serve as a learning lesson, and want to awaken in us our relationship with God, and the level of our faith. Today's text emphasizes in a special way the verb **touch**: the woman touches Jesus and is healed; Jesus takes the little girl by the hand and gives her life again.

We all carry our physical and moral sufferings. But our shortcomings, our weaknesses, our voids, are all reasons to want to touch Christ and enter in contact with him. Christ has the power to soothe our anxieties and revive our hope. We can question the quality of our own faith and ask ourselves what we are doing, so that this faith can progress, grow and reach greater maturity.

During the summer season, we have a little more time at our disposal to enjoy nature, to read, meditate and pray. Let us ask the Lord, on this summer Sunday, to increase our faith. **Amen.**
