Presider: Jesus said, "Before you offer your gift, go and be reconciled." Let us, in a moment of silence, recognize those failings in us that undermine relationships, and cause hurt to others As brothers and sisters in God's family we come together to ask our God for forgiveness:

We confess the sins that bring hurt and betrayal upon those who trust us.

All: Lord, have mercy.

Presider: We confess the sins that cause love to grow cold, and attitudes to harden.

All: Christ, have mercy.

Presider: We confess the sins that impede the way to forgiveness and reconciliation.

All: Lord, have mercy.

Presider: Holy God we often place our needs and desires above everything else. How reluctant we are to seek your will.

All: Lord, have mercy.

Presider: God, the Father of mercies, has reconciled the world to himself through the death and resurrection of his son, Jesus Christ, not counting our trespasses against us, but sending his Holy Spirit to shed abroad his love amongst us. By the ministry of reconciliation entrusted by Christ to his Church, we receive his pardon and peace to stand before him in his strength along, this day and evermore. Amen
