Stewardship Update: Your financial support for St. Matthew's has allowed us to end the first six months of the year in a relatively strong position. Our apportionment of \$2,263 per month has been fully paid, and after our loan payments, we have a relatively small deficit of \$3,752 at June 30, 2019. As of July 15, 2019, our Diocesan loan for the roof has reduced to approximately \$22,076. Our monthly payments are \$667.24 and we have made 2 lump sum payments totaling \$15,600.
