## Reflection for the Week-

The desert, this empty place, without connection, frightening most often, fascinating sometimes, as if to better get lost there. Because the desert is without a traced path, without landmarks, a place of wandering. The people of Israel wandered there for 40 years, experiencing every possible doubt. The Gospel of Mark presents the coming of Jesus among us as a great novelty: "Beginning of the Gospel of Jesus, Christ, Son of God". Immediately afterwards, John the Baptist enters the scene, inviting conversion and announcing the coming of the Lord. The Word of this Sunday leads us towards the one we are waiting for, who comes to trace in our hearts a route towards our brothers and sisters, through all the deserts of our time: deserts of solitude, of incomprehension, of despair, desert spiritual... With him, we can still hope. Like John, we are all called to the desert. We are called to set aside moments away from noise and put ourselves in a state that promotes the receptivity of the heart. God comes to meet us. He knocks at our door, and he expects a free and loving response from us. Be vigilant and take the time this week to prepare our hearts for the one who comes.
