Procedures for Sunday Services – Please note that for our Sunday worship services at 8:30 AM and 10:00 AM, all of the following health protocols will be in place:

- A shorter liturgy (approximately 45 min.)
- Doors and windows will be open. The ceiling fans will not be in use during services.

- Fellowship time in the Parish Hall will not exceed 20 min. Food and drink will not be served.
