### Reflection for the Week-

This week again, we are invited in a special way to listen to the Word of God to know how to respond to it. In the first reading, we heard the story of young Samuel's vocation. As with young Samuel, there are many callings in our life; we do not always hear them; we need the help and discernment of other people. The Gospel tells us about the vocation of the first disciples. Following the Words of John the Baptist, the disciples are quick to want to follow Jesus and stay with him. Jesus sees clearly what is happening in the hearts of the disciples and he asks them the question: "What are you looking for?" The question of Jesus also comes to us today; "What are you looking for?" But the Lord is always there to tell us: "Come and you will see!" Like the first disciples, we are invited to hear this call from Jesus and to remain with him. The Gospel therefore insists on the importance of the encounter with Christ. John the Baptist is the one who points to Jesus, who makes him known. Then it's Andrew who brings his brother to him. Philip, who was personally called by Jesus, will bring Nathanael to him. "How do you know me? » Great question from Nathanael to Jesus. And Jesus' response is to say to him: "I saw you under the fig tree". Nathanael discovers himself through the eyes of Jesus. The paths of each are different, but all are called to the same vocation: "missionary-disciples". And you, today, how can you respond to this invitation from Jesus who says to you: "Come and see"?
