Reflection of the week:

God places all his love in our hearts, which will then radiate to others. We are on the 6th Sunday of Easter, and we all know that Easter is the joy of the resurrected, it is the joy of our salvation. As the day of the Ascension approaches, God comes to us again, this Easter Sunday, to give us a special gift, the gift of his love. This is truly a message of hope for us Christians today. However, are we aware of what this love can represent? And what impact does this gift have on our everyday lives? The love of the neighbour that our Jesus commends to us admits no exceptions.
