A Note from our Pastoral Musician – In honour of Canada Day, today's prelude and postlude are works of Canadian composers :

Healey Willan, born in England in 1880, was a prolific composer of operas, symphonies, and music for band, piano, organ, choir and solo voice. He came to Canada in 1913 and taught at the Royal Conservatory of Music and the University of Toronto. He served as organist-choir director at the Anglican Church of St. Mary Magdalene in Toronto from 1921 until his death in 1968.

David Ouchterlony, born in Guelph, Ontario in 1914, was a student of Healey Willan. He began teaching at the Royal Conservatory of Music in 1940 and served as Principal for many years. Well known as an adjudicator across Canada, he adjudicated at the Kiwanis Music Festival here in Windsor during the 1970s. He served as organist-choir director at Timothy Eaton Memorial United Church in Toronto from 1946 until his death in 1987.

Dear St. Matthew's family,

It has been a long and challenging several months since we last met for in-person worship, so it was with pleasure that I announced that Bishop Todd had authorized the re-opening of all churches in the Diocese of Huron. For our Sunday worship services at 8:30 AM and 10:00 AM, all of the following health protocols will be in place:

- 1. A limit of 45 persons per service. We will not be taking advance registration; however, you will be asked to sign in (name and phone number) upon arrival.
- 2. A shorter liturgy (no longer than 45 min.)
- 3. Doors and windows will be open. The ceiling fans and air conditioning will not be in use during services.
- 4. We will maintain our practices of physical distancing, frequent hand washing/use of sanitizer, mask wearing (except for children under age 2, or for people who have health conditions that prevent them from wearing face coverings).
- 5. At this time, there will be no congregational singing.
