Today we enter the new liturgical year. We begin the season of Advent, a time of preparation for the great Christmas celebration. For several weeks now, merchants have been displaying their decorations and we are entering a period of frantic consumption. Through our many occupations, we risk forgetting the profoundly Christian aspect which challenges us and invites us to create a space for God in our everyday lives.

Advent gives us a reason to live, a reason to love and hope "now". It is an invitation to build a better world, according to God's desire. What does "watching" mean to us? Watching while waiting for the coming of God in our lives? Watching is not passively waiting for time to pass. To be awake is not to doze, one eye open, one eye closed. To keep watch is to listen attentively to the slightest sign of the arrival of the one we hope for. We are therefore invited to set out, to move, to break out of our habits and to meet the one who is coming.
