**Update from Parish Council** – January was a difficult month for the parish finances; we spent over an additional \$1,100 on snow removal and salting. Donations in the month (\$8,950) were below our average monthly budget of \$11,000, finishing January with a deficit of \$2,782. Our meetings are usually held the second Wednesday of the month, starting at 7:30 pm in the choir room, and everybody is welcome to attend. **Next meeting: March 12.**
