In the Gospel, we hear Jesus speak to us about the adventure of the grain of wheat which dies in the earth to produce 100 to 1 is that of the Kingdom of heaven, that of Jesus. This adventure is offered to us too. Jesus won his Glory by being Messenger of the Father's LOVE and by serving to the end. So for us. Jesus tells us: "If anyone serves me, my Father will. Today's Gospel ASKS ME... To see how to be useful to someone...

If we knew how to open our eyes, there are many places where we ask for voluntary help: visiting the sick or the elderly, helping certain organizations that prepare meals for poor people, visiting single people who suffer from loneliness. .. etc... Let's open our eyes and our hearts...
