Reflection for the week:

Palm Sunday introduces us to Holy Week. Throughout these next few days, we will symbolically relive the story of our salvation achieved in Jesus Christ. It's in looking toward the cross that we better understand how much he loved us. During this Holy Week, we are all invited to turn our gaze towards the cross. Jesus tells us that there is no greater love than to lay down your life for those you love. Looking towards the cross we take a little more awareness of God's immense love for us. This cross also invites us to change our outlook on the world. This week we are going to experience a celebration which will take on its meaning on Easter. On Maundy Thursday we will celebrate the institution of the Eucharist; On Good Friday, we will follow Jesus to the foot of the cross. Then during the Easter Vigil, we will celebrate his victory over death and sin. On Easter Day, we will all be witnesses of the Resurrection which will invite us to roll back the doors of our tombs to let in the new life that the cross of the Resurrected One offers us.
