Reflection for the Week

Sunday, November 3, 2024

The month of November invites us to a time of spiritual reflection, on the change that surrounds us and also invites us to remember the people who preceded us in faith, the members of our families who have left us and also to remember those who gave their lives for world peace. Nature's pause reminds us that we are not eternal as our lives change and owe a new season. Despite everything, the month of November is a month that speaks to us about life as a gift from God. November 1, All Saints' Day, is a time to give thanks to God for all the people who through faith have been convincing examples of following God's call. On November 2 we celebrate All Souls Day and we remember in Grace for our loved ones who are no longer with us. They have left this life and are now in the Hope of Resurrection with Christ.
