Reflection of the Week

Sunday, July 20

In the Gospel of Luke, the story of Martha and Mary beautifully illustrates the balance between service and contemplation. Martha, busy with preparations, embodies the spirit of hospitality, ensuring that Jesus and His disciples are cared for. However, in her busyness, she becomes overwhelmed and distracted, longing for Mary, who sits at Jesus' feet, listening to His teachings. This moment serves as a reminder that while service is essential, it should not overshadow our need for spiritual nourishment and connection with God. Jesus gently reminds Martha that Mary has chosen the better part, emphasizing the importance of prioritizing time with Him amidst our daily responsibilities. As we reflect on this passage, let us consider our own lives. Maybe we could create a daily routine in our schedule that includes dedicated time for both service and contemplation. For example, set aside specific times for prayer, meditation, or quiet reflection, alongside time for volunteering or helping others. We could also recognize that service itself can be a form of contemplation. Engage fully in the moment, appreciating the opportunity to connect with others and serve a greater purpose. This mindset can transform routine tasks into spiritual practices. By intentionally weaving together service and contemplation, you can create a rich and meaningful life that nourishes both your spirit and your commitment to others. This balance fosters personal growth, enhances relationships, and deepens your connection to the world around you.
