Reflection of the Week

Sunday, July 14, 2024

Always wanting to be famous can be harmful, especially when we don't know how to control our emotions and inner impulses. Extreme joy or anger, poorly managed, can lead to regrettable decisions or actions. This is what happens to Herod; moved by the spectacle, he loses self-control and lets himself be carried away by joy and emotion, to the point of making promises, all of which he believes he has mastered. This blindness led him to have John the Baptist - for whom he had esteem - beheaded. When our emotions are neither controlled nor disciplined, the worst can happen, the irreparable can happen. When our uncontrolled emotions dominate us, they make us prisoners and cause us to lose our free will. Hence the importance of knowing how to discipline and manage our emotions, and even more, of developing the gift of self-control. Let us therefore not be greedy for power, let us moderate our ambitions, and be content with little, in order to better grow in our Christian life. Let us know not to be slaves to our desires and our attachments. Knowing how to be sober and having self-control will also lead to the absence of all fear; following the example of Jesus and all the saints, this will allow us to dominate all situations calmly, however adverse they may seem. If fear is the source of all evil, the absence of fear, with control, is the source of infinite peace. He who is pure and humble is never afraid of anything or anyone.
