Backpack Ministry for the Detention Centre: for released homeless inmates we provide backpacks with essentials: eg. toiletries, towel, washcloth, socks, underwear etc. This is the time to buy those backpacks. The small ones that were \$5 each at Walmart this year are \$6. We have in hand enough for a part of the coming calendar year but can always use more. If you are shopping at Walmart or Staples and are willing to purchase and donate a backpack we would greatly appreciate it. They can be placed in the Narthex at church.

Procedures for Sunday Services – Please note that for our Sunday worship services at 8:30 AM and 10:00 AM, all of the following health protocols will be in place:

- Physical distancing (6ft.) is maintained between people of different "household bubbles". You will be asked to sign in (name and phone number) upon arrival.
- A shorter liturgy (no longer than 45 min.)
- Doors and windows will be open. The ceiling fans and air conditioning will not be in use during services.
- We will maintain our practices of physical distancing, frequent hand washing/use of sanitizer, mask wearing (except for children under age 2, or for people who have health conditions that prevent them from wearing face coverings).
- At this time, there will be no congregational singing. If you have questions or concerns, please be in touch with our rector.
