Backpack Ministry for the Detention Centre – We are preparing backpacks for the detention centre inmates being "released to the street" (*i.e.* homeless), filled with items such as toiletries, towel and washcloth, underwear and socks, and in the winter, also gloves, hat and scarf. We currently have enough toiletries, but we could use more backpacks, men's underwear (medium and large), winter hats, gloves (both thin "stretchy", and thicker ones), and small packets of tissues.
