Reflection for the week:

The first word of Christ after his resurrection is a word of **peace**, a word which, like a refrain, recurs regularly in today's texts: "peace be with you". The first gift of the resurrected person is the gift of peace which chases away fear and doubt: "Shalom". This peace is not that of the world, it is the peace entrusted as a precious heritage on the evening of Maundy Thursday: "It is the peace that I leave you, it is my peace that I give you"... The presence of the Lord causes joy. The joy of the resurrection is that which comes after fear, after suffering, after doubt. During this first meeting of Christ with his disciples, he gives them new life: "he poured out his breath on them and said to them: Receive the Holy Spirit", the breath of life. The gift of the Spirit recalls the text of the creation of Adam and Eve when the Spirit of God breathed life into them. It is a "new creation"... We are, renewed, recreated. In the Gospel, today, we are invited to do everything to try to know Jesus better in order to better LOVE and BELIEVE. To know Jesus better, his Word is truly what can reveal him to us best. Let us give ourselves time to listen and read his Word. THE LOVE that the Lord expects from us is the LOVE that we will give to all those who pass through our paths.
