## Reflection for the Week:

Sunday, June 23, 2024

This Sunday's Gospel is about faith. It is about the faith of the disciples, and ours today. Would Jesus really abandon his disciples at the height of the storm and danger? He is there on disciples' boat, and he is also present on our boats. See that Jesus once again calms the storm and the waters, but he also calms the storm in the hearts of the disciples, just as he is there, close to us, to calm the storms of our everyday lives. "Why are you so fearful?" Jesus asks his disciples "Don't you still have faith?" These two questions are also for us, today.

**Be Not Afraid. Why are we often fearful?** Jesus is telling us we must have faith. Christ is present in our life. Yes, of course, our life is a journey shaken by numerous storms of all kinds. We sometimes face uncontrollable distress. Christ says to us this morning: "Men of little faith, why do you fear?" He invites us to hope, despite all the difficulties we face. He invites us to look for a new landscape: "Let's go to the other shore"!

The gospel reminds us that, despite chaos and stormy weather, we can be at peace and maintain our serenity, as long as Christ is with us... even if he seems to be sleeping. "Why are you afraid? I am with you. Be confident."
