The Gospel of Mark shows us Jesus preaching the good news of the Kingdom of God. It all begins in Galilee. Jesus announces an urgent appeal: "Repent and believe the good news. Mark tells us about the vocation of the first apostles. Jesus does not choose them from among the guards of the temple but from simple sinners.

They are surprised in their work and drop everything; they begin to follow Jesus. For André, Simon, Jacques and Jean, it is the start of a great adventure. They will welcome the good news and their whole lives will be transformed.

Like these apostles, like Paul and like Jonah, we are all called by the Lord. As baptized and confirmed Christians, we are sent to be witnesses and messengers of the Gospel. We are sent together, in communion with one another and with Christ.

Let us pray together, with each other. May the Lord make us attentive to his calls. May he give us more generosity to respond to them. And may he make us artisans of unity, peace and reconciliation wherever we live.
