Reflection for the Week Trinity Sunday, May 26, 2024

Today we celebrate the feast of the Holy Trinity, God who is Father, Son and Holy Spirit. The clear message that emerges from this feast of the Holy Trinity is that our God is not a distant God but a God close to us, a God who shares our joys and our sorrows.

God is full of love and compassion, who welcomes all those who turn to him and that he is close to us, lives in our hearts and gives us the courage to face bad weather in our life; a God who freely gives us his Kingdom. He is also a God who invites us to imitate him in order to find happiness and become more human.

I end this reflection with the beautiful Trinitarian phrase of Paul in the second reading, a phrase that we use at the beginning of our Eucharistic celebrations: “May the grace of Jesus our Lord, the love of God the Father, and the communion of the Holy Spirit, be with you always” (*2 Corinthians 13, 13*)
