The three organ pieces this morning are Canadian compositions.

Allanson Brown (1902-1982), organist, choir director, and composer, came from England to Canada in 1932, holding positions in Ottawa churches until he became organist/choir director at Leamington United Church in 1954. **William France** (1912-1985), organist, composer, and pianist, was born in Milverton, Ontario. He studied composition with the great Canadian composer, Healey Willan. He held church positions in Tillsonburg, Sarnia, Stratford, and Ottawa. France's Prelude on “Slane” is based on the hymn tune we will be singing at the Offertory this morning. **James Leonard**, organist, choir director, and teacher earned a BMus degree from the University of Toronto in 1971 and held positions in churches in the Toronto area. He is now retired and living in British Columbia.
